Cambridge Forklift Certification Schools - Forklift Certification is mandatory in North America. Thus, forklift training programs are important both for companies and for people looking for work in industries as operators of forklifts. Forklift training focuses on safety and health issues included in forklift use. Safety issues affect both the driver of the forklift and employees and other individuals who are in the vicinity of the forklift. Businesses can be subject to penalties if they are caught with drivers who are un-certified during an inspection. There are many convincing reasons why businesses have to abide by forklift standards.

Most federal, state, and provincial rules need an employee evaluation of the skills essential for forklift safety before the employer signs off that the worker is certified. There are lots of ways to obtain forklift training for workers, like for instance on-line forklift training. Nevertheless, employers should be aware that forklift certification training is not "just a test". Proper forklift training should consist of some areas of study, like for instance theory and hands-on practice. Rules do not require employers to have an outside organization to certify operators of forklifts.

The recommended program for a quality forklift certification service consists of both classroom training and an on-site component. Classroom training typically features informative sessions with videos, power point presentations, discussions and models. Students normally must write a test to check for subject matter understanding. Certificates of completion are given upon successful completion of the class.

The use of the equipment evaluation requires the trainee to understand the job site dangers, pre-operational equipment check, a pass/fail operational test and operational instruction.

The following subject areas would normally be covered in the training: Controls & Instrumentations; Understanding legislations and regulations; Engine maintenance and Operation; Steering and Maneuvering; Visibility, Fork & Attachment Restrictions; Rated Capacities, Stability, Maintenance & Inspection; Refueling; Load Control; Pedestrians, and Dangerous Places & Rough Terrain Operation. Moreover, there are training courses available for employees who are transitioning to new job positions.
