Cambridge Telehandler Training Courses - Employers are responsible for making sure that their supervisory and operating personnel are trained to work competently making use of telehandler machines. The skill level of workers must be assessed. If deficiencies are found, employers should provide training so that workers get the necessary level of ability. The responsibility level of the person should be taken into account when training is provided. Effective training will solve whatever deficiencies in the understanding, knowledge and skills of telehandler operators and supervisors. Training may be undertaken through in-house session or by hiring an external training provider. An assessment at the completion of the training period would determine whether or not the learning goals have been met.

Federal, state/provincial and local regulations set out guidelines for basic telehandler operator training and testing. Basic training does not address such topics as the lifting of persons, the lifting of suspended loads, utilizing other attachments, or the use of rotating machinery. Further training would need to be undertaken if such tasks are needed on the work place.

Inspection and maintenance

Like whichever machine, a telehandler needs effective maintenance. The machinery inevitably would suffer wear eventually. Correct maintenance is essential to ensuring safe utilization of the telehandler machine. Inspections and checks are vital to ongoing maintenance procedures. Operators must have machine-specific training in order to monitor, prevent and rectify problems associated with damage, wear and deterioration. Employees need experience and competence in both breakdown and periodic maintenance. The preventive maintenance directions of the manufacturer should be viewed seriously and followed, considering such factors as frequency of use and environmental conditions in the work setting.

The responsibility for making sure that the telehandler and its attachments are in good working order lies with both the user and owner of the machinery. General maintenance is usually done by the telehandler owner whilst pre-use inspections are usually done by the user.
