Cambridge Crane License - Crane operators must be "credentialed", that means they should have a crane operator certification or license. Credentialing is considered a mandatory governmental requirement in order to practice as a crane operator. Licensing involves training and final test and evaluation.

To operate any kind of heavy machinery like for example cranes, the operator requires safety training. License training for crane operators combines specialized training programs and the on-the-job supervised work. These training programs are provided by industry training and certification organizations. The content of training programs for crane operators could vary depending on the laws and requirements of the local industry.

Training and certification could be offered for various kinds of cranes, like overhead cranes, mobile cranes, articulator cranes and tower cranes. Overhead cranes are commonly made use of in manufacturing. Mobile cranes transport heavy machines to sites where the task is to be performed. Articulator cranes are used in order to load materials and equipment onto truck beds and other heavy machines. The biggest kind of crane is the Tower cranes, usually found in big sea ports.

The crane department supervisor would normally have the authority to give basic hands-on crane training, within the manufacturing sector. After the practical part, the person training might need to pass a course. Upon successful completion of the course, the trainee would be licensed or certified.

Simulated crane operator training is provided in various industrial environments, that allow operators the ability to gain hands-on skills without putting other employees and equipment at risk. The simulated environment offers a set of virtual activities with a simulated crane, such as realistic controls. By mastering crane operation in simulated training, the operator will have the ability to operate real cranes on the job.

Once certified and licensed, crane operators ought to partake in continuing education to regularly upgrade their knowledge and skills. Continuous crane operator training is normally recommended for technicians so they can know updates in crane technology and safety features.
